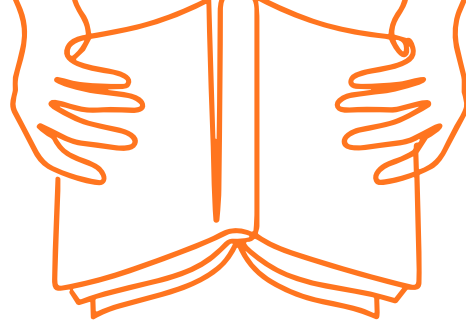

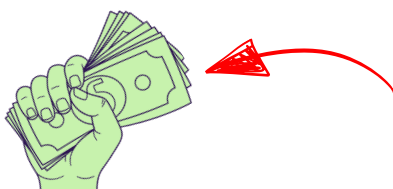

Talking with God is one of the most exciting and life-changing adventures you can experience! *How?* Every time you choose to spend time with Him, supernatural things happen- not only in your heart, but in the world around you!

When you invite God into your everyday life something incredible happens. You begin to see the world through God's eyes. Things that once seemed scary don't feel quite so big anymore. - Before a game or playdate
- Before bedtime
- Before meals
- When something exciting happens
- When something difficult happens
- Whenever you simply want to talk with Jesus

DAY 1

The Adventure Begins

Bible Verse

1 John 3:1^{ESV}

“See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are.”

God Loves Me.

Before we embark on our adventure of prayer, we need to know one very important truth: God loves you!

Every great adventure begins with someone inviting you to come along. Do you know that God has invited you on the greatest adventure of all? It’s a life spent walking with Him!

Before you ever prayed your first prayer . . .

Before you ever went to church . . .

Before you were ever born . . .

GOD LOVED YOU!

The Bible tells us that God is our Heavenly Father. You are never forgotten, alone or too small for God to notice! You are so important to Him. That means He knows you best! He knows your favorite color, food, game and place. He knows every birthmark, freckle and bruise. He knows you inside out and loves you more than you know!

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for His deep, never failing love for you! Then, ask God to show you how to spread Jesus’ love to the people around you.

DAY 2

Bible Verse

Jeremiah 29:12^{ESV}

“Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you.”

God Hears Me.

Have you ever tried talking to someone who wasn't listening? They seem like they're listening to you, but you can tell they're just distracted. Maybe they're on their phone, watching television, or just busy doing other things. It's so frustrating when no one *really* listens to what you're trying to say!

Jesus has a superpower that allows Him to listen to you whenever you talk to Him! He's **NEVER** too busy or distracted to listen. He **ALWAYS** listens. He hears the whispers you speak, the cries you share, and the thoughts you secretly think.

Prayer isn't about saying the perfect words at the perfect time. It's simply sharing your heart with God! He cares for you, and hears every word.

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for always being there to listen to you! Then, ask God to help you talk to Him as a friend everyday.

Bible Verse

1 John 1:9^{ESV}

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

God Forgives Me.

Have you ever made a mistake?

Everyone has!

Sometimes we say unkind things.

Sometimes we break things by accident.

Sometimes we choose our way instead of God's way.

The best news ever is that God forgives us every, single time! He doesn't keep a memory of our mistakes.

When we pray and tell God we're sorry, He doesn't stay angry with us.

He is quick to forgive us, because He already paid for our sins on the cross!

God **LOVES** giving fresh starts!

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for always being a forgiving God! Then, tell God all the things you're sorry for, and ask for His help to become more like Him everyday.

Bible Verses

Philippians 4:6-7^{ESV}

“⁶do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.”

God Gives Me Peace.

Have you ever been nervous about something?

How about before meeting a new friend, going to a new place or doing something you’ve never done before?

God understands those feelings. Instead of carrying our worries around like a big weight, He invites us to bring them to Him in prayer.

Remember, God is *a/ways* listening! He loves you, and wants to give you peace in exchange for your worries.

God’s peace doesn’t always make our problems disappear, but it does remind us that we aren’t alone and that He’s in control of **EVERYTHING!**

Whenever worry starts to grow, let your prayers grow bigger!

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for always listening and caring for what worries you! Then, ask God to remind you that He is **BIGGER** than any problem you face.

Bible Verse

Jeremiah 12:11^{ESV}

"For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope."

God Gives Me Purpose.

Every great adventure or treasure hunt uses a map! A treasure map shows you where to go, with the treasure often marked by a big **X**. It's exciting to know you're following the right path to something valuable and good!

Did you know God has a perfect plan for your life? **Just like a treasure map, God knows every step of the journey.** He knows where to turn, when to keep going, and exactly how to lead you to the good things He has planned for you.

You don't have to worry about getting lost, because God is your loving Heavenly Father. He is always with you, guiding and helping you make wise choices.

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for always knowing the right path for your life, and for guiding you every step of the way! Thank Him for His perfect plan and always being with you on the journey. Then, ask God to help you trust in Him, follow His direction, and have faith in His plan.

DAY 6

Bible Verse

Isaiah 40:31^{ESV}

“but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.”

God Renews Me.

Have you ever had to wait for something? Maybe it's time to watch your favorite TV show, eat dinner, visit a friend's house, or go somewhere fun.

Sometimes waiting feels sooo . . . hard! It can seem like time is moving as slowly as a turtle.

Waiting for Jesus to answer our prayers can feel the same way. But Jesus gives us a wonderful promise: while we wait, He gives us His supernatural strength and power! His strength helps us to stay patient, continue trusting Him, and remember that His timing is perfect!

So, what can we do while we wait? We read God's Word, worship Him and continue talking with Him through prayer! As we spend time with Jesus, He helps us grow stronger in our faith while we wait for His perfect plan.

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for being with you, even when you have to wait. Thank Him for being a God who understands what it feels like to wait and always keeping His promises. Then, ask God for His strength, peace, and patience as you wait on Him.

DAY 7

Bible Verses

1 Chronicles 16:8-12^{ESV}

“⁸Oh give thanks to the LORD; call upon his name; make known his deeds among the peoples! ⁹Sing to him, sing praises to him; tell of all his wondrous works! ¹⁰Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice! ¹¹Seek the LORD and his strength; seek his presence continually! ¹²Remember the wondrous works that he has done, his miracles and the judgments he uttered,”

God Does Wondrous Things.

Have you ever seen something that made you say, “WOW!”? Maybe you’ve stood on top of a tall mountain, looked out from the top of a huge skyscraper, or ridden a Ferris wheel high into the sky. Seeing amazing things like these can fill us with awe and wonder!

Jesus is even more wonderful than anything we can see in nature. He does amazing things every day! When we look around, we can see His beautiful creation and all the ways He care for us. His love, power, and goodness are all around us.

We can make Jesus known by telling others about the wonderful things He’s done in our lives. When we share His love, kindness, and faithfulness, we help others see just how amazing He is!

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for being a God who does wonderful, amazing things every single day! Then, ask God to help you see His wonder in the little and big things each day. Ask for the courage to share His love and kindness with others so they can know how amazing He is.

DAY 8

Bible Verse

Ephesians 2:10^{ESV}

"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

God Prepared Me.

Trying new things can be hard!

Sometimes we feel ready and excited, like we can do anything! Other times, we make mistakes and feel like giving up. Maybe you're learning to tie your shoes, studying a new subject at school, or trying a new sport.

Starting something new isn't always easy, but God gives us an amazing promise. He has already prepared us for the good things He has planned for us! God created each of us with a purpose, and He has given us the gifts, abilities and opportunities we need to do good and bring Him glory.

So, if you're learning something new, don't be afraid. Trust that God is with you every step of the way. Keep trying, keep learning and remember that you can show others the love of Jesus through your words, actions and attitude.

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for creating you with a special purpose, and for preparing you to do good things for Him! Thank Him for the gifts and abilities He's given you. Then, ask God for the strength when learning new things, the courage to keep trying even when it's hard, wisdom to trust Him every step of the way, and to point others to Jesus in all that you do.

Bible Verses

Matthew 6:31-33^{ESV}

“³¹Do not be anxious, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ ³²For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your Heavenly Father knows that you need them all. ³³But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.”

God Provides For Me.

We all have things we need. We need food to eat, water to drink, clothes to wear, and a safe place to live.

Sometimes we wish we had more things, or that life looked a little different. But Jesus reminds us that our Heavenly Father knows exactly what we need and cares for us deeply. He promises to provide for His children. His provision may not always look the way we expect, but we can trust that He always knows what’s best for us.

Because we belong to God, we don’t have to live in fear or worry. He knows everything about us- even the number of hairs on our heads! He knows our thoughts, our feelings, and every physical, emotional and spiritual need we have.

Our job is to keep seeking, trusting and following God. As we do, we can rest in knowing that our loving Heavenly Father will take care of us!

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for being your loving Heavenly Father who knows exactly what you need and always caring for you each day. Then, ask God to help you trust Him, rest in His care, and remember that He will always provide what you need as you seek Him.

DAY 10

Bible Verse

Deuteronomy 31:6^{ESV}

“Be strong and courageous. Do not fear or be in dread of them, for it is the Lord your God who goes with you. He will not leave you or forsake you.”

God Strengthens Me.

We all face things that are scary sometimes . . . the dark, the really tall, twisty slide at the park, a bully, or even broccoli.

Fear can make us want to stop, hide or give up! It can make it hard to take the next step God is calling us to take. But Jesus gives us an amazing promise: we don't have to be afraid, because He is always with us! He promises to **NEVER** leave us, or turn His back on us.

Because of that wonderful promise, we can be strong and courageous. No matter what we face, Jesus goes with us every step of the way. We can trust Him, keep moving forward, and know that He will help us through every challenge and adventure!

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for always being with you and for His promise to never leave you. Thank Him because you never have to face anything alone. Then, ask for God to give you the strength and courage whenever you feel afraid. Pray that He will help you trust Him, remember His promises, and boldly follow Him wherever He leads.

DAY 11

Bible Verses

Matthew 11:28-30^{ESV}

“²⁸Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.”

God Is My Rest.

Life can be busy sometimes! Between school, sports, activities, friends and family, it can feel like there’s always something to do.

When life feels overwhelming, Jesus understands exactly how we feel. He knows when we’re tired, worried, or carrying too much. That’s why He invites us to come to Him. Jesus is the One who gives our hearts and souls true rest. While taking a nap or having some quiet time can help our bodies, the deep peace we need comes from spending time with Him.

Whenever life feels busy, take time to pray and tell Jesus what’s on your heart. Give Him your worries, your busy schedule, and everything that’s making you feel tired. As you trust Him, He will fill you with His peace and give you the rest your heart needs.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for being the rest that your soul and heart need. Thank Him for always welcoming you into His presence, no matter how busy life gets. Then, ask God to remind you to slow down, spend time with Him, and find peace in His presence.

DAY 12

The Adventure of Prayer

Bible Verse

Matthew 19:26^{ESV}

“But Jesus looked at them and said, “With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.”

God of Possible.

Have you ever looked at something and thought, “*That’s impossible!*” Flying like a superhero? *Impossible!* Reading people’s minds? *Impossible!* Never having to take a bath again? *Definitely impossible!*

But when it comes to God, **NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE** for Him! He is the God of possible! There isn’t a problem He can’t solve, a heart He can’t heal, or a person He can’t save. God can do things that are far beyond what we could ever imagine.

So, when you face something that seems too big or too hard, remember that God is with you. You may not be able to do it on your own, but God can do what you cannot.

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for being the one true God, the God with whom all things are possible. Thank Him for His power, His love, and for always being able to do more than we could ever imagine. Then, ask God to help you trust in His power, believe that nothing is too hard for Him, and give you the faith to pray bold prayers, knowing that He is always at work.

DAY 13

Bible Verse

Romans 15:13^{ESV}

“May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.”

God Is My Hope.

What is hope? Hope is more than just feeling happy or expecting something good to happen. **Real hope is much bigger than positive thinking or having a good attitude.**

Our hope is found in Jesus! Because Jesus died on the cross for our sins and rose from the dead, we can trust that He’s already won the greatest victory! He defeated sin, death, and the grave so that everyone who believes in Him can have eternal life.

No matter what challenges we face, we can have hope because Jesus is always with us. As God’s children, we carry that hope in our hearts every day. We can trust Him, knowing that He is in control and that His victory is our victory!

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank Jesus for dying on the cross for your sins and rising again, giving you victory over sin and death. Thank Him for the hope you have because of His great love and His finished work. Then, ask God to help you hold on to that hope in every situation, no matter how difficult it may seem. Pray that He will give you opportunities to share His hope with others so they can know His love too.

Bible Verse

Ephesians 4:32^{ESV}

“Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.”

Choose Kindness.

Imagine you’re walking down the hallway at school, and someone drops all of their books, lunch, pencils and crayons!

You have two choices . . .

You can walk right past them and ignore their need . . .

OR, you can *choose* to stop and help.

Kindness is choosing to love people with your words and actions. It’s helping someone who needs it without expecting anything in return.

Jesus showed kindness to **EVERYONE**. Yes, *everyone*! He cared for people, helped those in need, and loved others- even when they didn’t deserve it. He is our perfect example of what kindness looks like.

Every day, God gives us opportunities to be kind. Whether it’s helping a friend, encouraging someone who’s sad, sharing what we have, or including someone who feels left out. We can show the love of Jesus through simple acts of kindness.

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank Jesus for showing the greatest kindness by giving His life for our sins. Thank Him for being the perfect example of love, compassion, and kindness. Then, ask God to help you choose kindness in your words and actions, even when it is difficult or when no one is watching.

DAY 15

Bible Verses

1 Timothy 2:1-2^{ESV}

"¹First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, ²for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.."

Our Leaders.

Leaders make important decisions every day.

Parents *lead* families.

Teachers *lead* classrooms.

Pastors *lead* churches.

Police officers and firefighters *protect* communities.

Government leaders *make decisions* for our country.

The Bible tells us to pray for them because they need God's wisdom.

Even if we don't know them personally, our prayers matter.

When we pray for leaders, we're asking God to help them make wise, loving, and Godly decisions.

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for the leaders in your life and the world. Then, ask God to give them wisdom, courage, kindness and the hearts to want to honor Him.

Bible Verses

Hebrews 10:24-25^{ESV}

“²⁴And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.”

Church Family.

Have you ever noticed how many people serve at church?

Some greet families at the door.
Some teach kids.
Some sing.
Some pray.
Some help behind the scenes.

Everyone has an important job, because we're all part of God's family.

Our church isn't just a building—it's a group of people following Jesus together. Today, pray for our Pastors, Children's Ministry Director, Dream Teamers, Worship Team and everyone who serves. Ask God to help our church share His love with our community.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for our church family. Pray for all of the people who serve to help our **Heaven Full, Hell Empty** vision become a reality. Then, ask God to give them wisdom, courage, kindness and the heart to honor Him.

DAY 17

Bible Verses

Jonah 1-3

Read this story in your Bible or the YouVersion Bible app.

God Honors Obedience.

"I don't feel like cleaning my room, picking up my toys, or doing my homework!"

"Mom, Dad, do I really have to do that?"

Sometimes it's hard to obey, especially when we don't feel like it, but God teaches us that obedience is important. He wants us to obey our parents and guardians, and He also wants us to obey Him.

God doesn't ask us to obey because He wants to make life harder. He asks us to obey because He loves us, knows what's best for us, and wants to help us grow. When we trust God and follow His ways, we experience the blessings that come from walking in His plan.

The story of Jonah reminds us that running away from God is never the best choice. Even when Jonah disobeyed, God was patient, loving, and gave him another chance. God wants us to choose obedience because we love and trust Him.

Think about these questions:

- Is it ever hard for you to obey God? Why?
- Why do you think Jonah tried so hard to run away from God?
- How do trust and obedience work together?

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for His patience, love, and forgiveness when you make mistakes. Thank Him for always giving you another chance and for helping you grow each day. Then, ask God to give you a willing heart and an obedient spirit that desires to follow Him.

Bible Verses

Matthew 25:14-30

Read this story in your Bible or the YouVersion Bible app.

God Given Talents.

Do you love receiving gifts? Most of us do! Did you know that God has given each of us special gifts and talents? He gives us these gifts so we can help others and bring glory to Him.

You might be thinking, *"I don't have any special talents."* But that's not true! **God has created every person with unique gifts and abilities.** Some people are great at encouraging others, showing kindness, helping those in need, teaching, creating, or making others feel loved. Every gift is important, and God can use them all for His Kingdom.

Think about these questions:

- What gifts or talents do you think God has given you?
- How can you use the gifts God has given you to love others and glorify Him?
- What special gifts do you see in the people in your family?

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for the unique gifts and talents He has given you. Thank Him for creating you with a special purpose, and for giving you opportunities to serve Him and others. Then, ask God to help you discover the gifts He has placed inside of you!

DAY 19

Bible Verses

Psalm 23

Read this story in your Bible or the YouVersion Bible app.

God Is My Shepherd.

Why does the Bible talk so much about sheep and shepherds?

God uses this picture throughout Scripture because it helps us understand how much He loves and cares for us.

Sheep need a shepherd because they can't protect themselves from danger, often wander off, and need someone to guide them to food, water, and safety. They learn to recognize and trust their shepherd's voice because they know he will care for them.

Jesus calls Himself the Good Shepherd. He loves us, protects us, guides us, and never leaves us. He knows each one of us by name and always wants what is best for us. We can trust Him to lead us, care for us, and help us when we need Him.

Think about these questions:

- What makes Jesus the Good Shepherd?
- How does it make you feel to know that Jesus loves you, cares for you, and is always watching over you?

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for being your Good Shepherd who always loves, cares for, protects, and guides you. Thank Him for never leaving your side and for faithfully leading you every day. Then, ask God to help you trust Him more and follow His voice with confidence.

DAY 20

Bible Verses

Genesis 45

Read this story in your Bible or the YouVersion Bible app.

It's All In The Family.

Living with family can be hard sometimes! Brothers and sisters don't always get along. We might argue over toys, snacks, whose turn it is, or what to watch on TV. Disagreements happen, but how we respond makes *THE* biggest difference.

The story of Joseph teaches us a powerful lesson about forgiveness. Joseph's brothers were jealous of him and treated him very badly. Many years later, Joseph became a powerful ruler in Egypt. When his brothers came to him needing food, Joseph had every reason to be angry or get even. Instead, he chose forgiveness.

He welcomed them with kindness, hugged them, and cared for their family.

God wants us to treat our brothers and sisters with love, even when it's difficult.

Choosing forgiveness doesn't mean what happened was okay, but it does mean we choose to love others the way God loves us. When we forgive, we show the kindness and grace that Jesus has shown to us.

Think about these questions:

- When is it hardest to get along with your brothers or sisters?
- How did Joseph choose forgiveness instead of revenge?
- How can you show kindness and forgiveness the next time there's a disagreement at home?

Pray About It.

Take some time to pray. Thank God for His forgiveness, patience, and unfailing love, even when you make mistakes. Thank Him for showing you grace and teaching you how to forgive others. Then, ask God to help you respond to conflict with kindness, patience, and forgiveness at home.

DAY 21

Bible Verse

1 Thessalonians 5:17^{ESV}

“pray without ceasing,”

Pray Always.
